TRAINING COMMITTEE (Joe)

- Winter 2023 Training:

Updates from Joe: One individual who failed the rater exam said that he did a lot of studying but that the class and the quizzes did not prepare him for the rater exam. Some else who worked at GDS, also felt that quizzes were not as hard as the rater exam. The first individual was under the impression that most people failed but 13/18 passed, which is higher than national average.



Communications for possible additional training, if it helps attendees to have smaller class sizes but the most logical place for students is summertime. We will be discussing it at the next training committee meeting and will check with PSD if they prefer smaller classes.

Stretch code HERS Course (Chris)

- Two guys at Auburndale Builders are working to develop a 6-module course (half person/half on demand); provide class to builders, architects and designers to translate what is different for the carpenter building a home to a HERS 42
- Meeting Thursdays at 4pm to develop the course.
- (Mike) Mass Save is also doing stretch code training.
- (Keegan) PSD is the vendor for the Mass Save codes and standards training program. ICF does the workforce development which is a lot of overlaps. But they are separately implemented paths.
- Nick's project was featured in a Mass Save case study webinar, PH retrofit SF in Newton.
- Mass Save is involved with Aaron Gunderson of PH for a Stretch HERS 42 Course. Synergies.
- Who are the next logical additions to our team to develop this course?
- This is supposed to be a builder-friendly version. Want to focus on hands on piece, what do builders/carpenters need to know about what's different for them to do these projects.

Webinar for HS Students on March 8th (Chris/Cindy) - Getting into the building science industry, gives them background on how building science connects to HERs ratings and energy efficiency, added trade schools to our distribution lists for training, Betsy will send along webinar info to that list. STANDARDS (Cindy)

- Out for Public Comment:
 - o <u>PDS-01 BSR/RESNET/ICC 301-2022 Addendum C-202x (ANSI)</u>: Jan 13 Feb 27 Covers multiple definitions and software consistency issues. 6 comments as of 2/6
 - o MINHERS Addendum 72 Feb 6 Mar 22 File and Field QA this is one we should spend some time discussing. There are 3 comments so far as of 2/6.
 - o MINHERS Addendum 62f Provider Disciplinary Actions No PC dates
- Ongoing Work:
 - o Addendum D Insulation Grading working group
 - Work in progress, grade 1, 2, 3 for insulation grading. Not a lot to talk about
 - Update on Remote QA Standard Amendment proposal: SDC900 task force has met twice and are continuing their work. Hoping to see something come out soon particularly since the Presidential COVID Emergency Proclamation is due to be lifted on May 11, 2023.
 - ENERGY STAR has already announced the EPA's temporary allowance will officially end on June 11, 2023.



- RESNET is still discussing. Survey went out, they may make some kind of interim call.
- Ocid climate heat pumps need to pick up discussion from earlier in the year, particularly regarding how raters are modeling COP.
 - Need to get back on that, from last year.
- RESNET 301 & 380 subcommittee CFIS systems proposal. Need more work to specify
 how to account for these in the model and also for the additional load created due to dumping
 hot/cold air into the system.
 - Seeing what is left to be done
- O Due to end of year reporting, RESNET extended the public comment period for MINHERS Addendum 72 (Field/File QA) from March 22nd to April 7th.
 - Chris asked if we should send in letter of support for the protocol survey.
 - Cindy encourages participation in the survey.
 - Two different questions:
 - 1- Remote inspection process came with defaults for testing, none passed code so no one did it
 - o 2 Remote QA, widely adopted, could have a great impact
 - Promote the survey, help people understand what the two questions mean, and let the industry speak.

QAD (Jonathan) left halfway through meeting Betsy reported.

- QAD committee will join the Standards Committee on March 8th at 11 AM to discuss the proposed changes to the QA standard. They will meeting again for their regular meeting on March 23rd. Deadline for comments is April 7th.

ENERGY CODES (Mike T)

- Nothing new.
- Code presentation for Norwalk CT- Cindy
- Mike had internet issues and dropped off, but Chris assumed nothing new.
- Code presentation in CT (Cindy). Group of building officials in Norwalk CT asked us to speak about the HERS rating process to code officials, Cindy volunteers to attend and present. Chris says that works and opens if anyone else wants to support.
- Mike is back. Will follow up with Cindy about CT.
- Mass has some mid-year dates coming up and almost like we have moved from a 3-year to a 6-month cycle for the next year and a half.

EMBODIED CARBON (Nicole)

- Boston Society of Architects (BSA)- has a monthly meeting. Chris says you can canvas 7 different architecture firms that way. Good idea to attend, great way to get word out on embodied carbon to people on the design end.
- Boston Architectural College (BAC) Nicole will reach out.
- Betsy- RESNET advisory council is meeting on 2/21, this is the committee that will advise RESNET on whether to create the embodied carbon standard.
 - We reviewed the slide deck.
 - Meeting yesterday surfaced disagreement about whether to include a reference home in the standard. Chris Magwood is advising to do a phased approach because he doesn't expect pushback on defining the measurements but is concerned that the reference home could be contentious if materials are specified. This is different from what we had originally envisioned. Chris Magwood has found that whole LCA approach gets less pushback.
 - Betsy and Andy will be presenting to realtors in Maine to the Sustainability Advisory Group of the Greater Portland Board of Realtors in Maine on Embodied Carbon.
 - Chris wants an update from Mike on Maines code.
 - Joe does diagnostic testing, adopted 2015 codes, talk of 2021 is stretch
 - City of Portland adopted 2021 as a stretch code option, enforcement is sporadic (mostly larger coastal communities). There are municipal building inspectors.
 - Chris- Betsy and Andy should check out what building code they are dealing with. Is Maine adopting a new stretch code and how that relates to embodied carbon. They will ask you some building code questions. New for Maine to have a robust building code. Loop in Joe. Maine doesn't have enforcement for towns 4000 or less.
 - At NESEA Conference, we were not selected to present on embodied carbon but will have a room on embodied carbon during lunch. Chris recommends getting some lunch items so they will attend the discussion.
 - o Betsy will check with Gale on catering and get an update from NESEA on catering.
